Carolyn Bronstein is the Vincent de Paul Professor of Communication and Media Studies in the College of Communication at DePaul University. She is a feminist media scholar with research interests in gender and sexuality studies, women's movement history, media and new technologies, and the structural conditions affecting



women's participation in cultural and creative industries, especially advertising. Her academic work is shaped by interdisciplinary training, drawing from communication theory, media history and gender and sexuality studies.

INFLUENTIAL MENTORS AT UW

The strength of the history program in the J-School was remarkable. UW had one of the only Journalism and Mass Communication doctoral programs with multiple historians on the faculty. I was so fortunate to be taught and mentored by James L. Baughman, Jim Danky, Bob McChesney and Steve Vaughn.



James L. Baughman was my doctoral advisor and greatest champion. He taught me to write media history with meticulous attention to sources and to mine unpublished manuscript collections for new insights. Jim encouraged my research on the anti-pornography movement and recognized that it tapped into major social currents in American culture and would have lasting impact.



Linda Gordon in the UW Women's History program taught me about American feminism and the divides within the women's movement of the 1970s and 1980s that centered around questions of sexuality. She encouraged me to write several seminar papers about pornography that ultimately led to my dissertation and greatly influenced my trajectory as a scholar.



Suzanne Pingree and Jo Ellen Fair were important feminist mentors who validated my interest in gender and sexuality studies. They showed me that women's production and reception of popular culture texts was a significant, emerging area of research and helped me develop the methodological tools to study it.
